

**THE VALE OF GLAMORGAN COUNCIL
 DRYDEN ROAD, (PART), PENARTH
 TRAFFIC CALMING SCHEME 2022**

Notice is hereby given that the Vale of Glamorgan Council, in exercise of its powers under Sections 90A and C of the Highways Act 1980 (as amended), the provisions contained within The Highways (Road Humps) Regulations 1999 and all other enabling powers, proposes to construct traffic calming measures as detailed in the Schedule to this Notice.

Full details of the proposals, to include a copy of the proposed Order, and Plan No T/22/52/MS may be inspected on the Council's website at www.valeofglamorgan.gov.uk/legalnotices and any objections you may have to this proposal must be submitted to the Director of Environment & Housing (Ref.IF949) in writing or by email to C1V@valeofglamorgan.gov.uk by **Friday 11th November 2022** and must contain the grounds upon which you object.

Persons objecting to the proposed traffic calming are advised that in view of the Local Government (Access to Information) Act 1985 this Council is legally obliged to make any comments received in response to the proposal open to public inspection.

SCHEDULE

Proposed Dryden Road, Penarth traffic calming as specified below:

Traffic Calming Feature	Location
Road narrowing incorporating an uncontrolled crossing, with buildouts on either side of the carriageway, which will reduce the width from approximately 5.0 metres to 3.5 metres.	The centre of which will be approximately 20 metres in a easterly direction from its junction with Tennyson Road.
Rain garden, ostensibly a build-out feature, reducing the width of the running carriageway to approximately 3.1 metres, with approximate dimensions: 50 metres x 1.4 metres.	The centre of which will be approximately 113 metres in an easterly and southerly direction from its junction with Tennyson Road.
Rain garden, ostensibly a build-out feature, reducing the width of the running carriageway to approximately 3.1 metres, with approximate dimensions: 12.5 metres x 1.4 metres.	The centre of which will be approximately 151 metres in an easterly and southerly direction from its junction with Tennyson Road.
Rain garden, ostensibly a build-out feature, reducing the width of the running carriageway to approximately 3.0 metres, with approximate dimensions: 6.0 metres x 1.4 metres.	The centre of which will be approximately 171 metres in an easterly and southerly direction from its junction with Tennyson Road.
