• Eight assaults were committed against Welsh emergency workers every day during the first six months of this year, new figures have revealed.

• More than 1,360 assaults were committed in the six-month period from 01 January 2021 – 30 June 2021.

• They included kicking, slapping, head-butting and verbal abuse, and ranged from common assault to serious premeditated attacks involving grievous bodily harm.




- The latest Home Office statistics show attacks on firefighters in England & Wales rose to 934 attacks in the last year up from 899.
- 18 per cent of these attacks involved objects being thrown at firefighters or appliances (167 incidents).
- Attacks resulted in 54 injuries
- Increase during the run up to Bonfire night- SWFRS 50% of attacks
- Zero tolerance approach to attacks of our staff
