Report Title:	Renewal of Public Space Protection Orders for the Prevention of Alcohol Related Anti-Social Behaviour			
Purpose of Report:	To agree the renewal of the existing Public Space Protection Orders to ensure strong and effective control and management arrangements aimed at preventing incidence of alcohol related anti-social behaviour in public spaces

Executive Summary:

This report seeks approval to renew the existing Public Space Protection Orders (PSPO's) that expired in October 2020, for a further 3 years and to add 6 new locations aimed at the prevention of alcohol related Anti-Social Behaviour.

The additional areas include Cosmeston Country Park, Porthkerry Country Park, Penarth Pier and Esplanade, Ogmore beach and surrounds, Rhoose Point and Llantwit Major beach; to capture all areas where there have been incidents over the summer and where Council Officers and the Police had limited ability to manage anti-social behaviour resulting from excessive of alcohol consumption. This will enable the Council and the Police to provide a proportionate and robust response to addressing areas of alcohol related anti-social behaviour across many areas of the Vale of Glamorgan.

The Council has undertaken a 12-week consultation period over the summer and this report includes the results of the feedback, for Council consideration.

Recommendations

- 1. That Council notes the outcome of the 12-week consultation exercise.
- **2.** That Council agrees the renewal of the existing Public Space Protection Orders for a further 3-years.
- **3.** That Council agree to create new Orders at 6 new locations detailed within the report for a 3-year period.

Reasons for Recommendations

- 1. So that the views of all stakeholders are considered.
- 2. To ensure the Council and South Wales Police have appropriate powers to tackle alcohol related Anti-Social Behaviour, in order to protect the quality of lives of those who live, work and visit restricted areas.
- **3.** To ensure that these additional areas also have robust powers to tackle alcohol related Anti- Social Behaviour, in order to protect the quality of lives of those who live, work and visit restricted areas.

1. Background

- 1.1 Council on the 27th September 2017 (minute no. C333 refers) approved the introduction of alcohol related Public Space Protection Orders (PSPO's) for a 3-year period to replace previous Orders, made under the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001, which were due to expire on 20th October 2017.
- 1.2 Under the Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 (the Act), a Local Authority, after consultation with the police, Police and Crime Commissioner and other relevant bodies, is able to make a PSPO.
- 1.3 The purpose of the PSPO's created was to assist the Council and its partners to provide a proportionate and robust response to addressing areas of alcohol related anti-social behaviour (ASB) across the Vale of Glamorgan.
- 1.4 In this case the behaviour to be restricted on the existing Orders and additional areas, is alcohol related ASB only and the Orders are designed to ensure that the law-abiding majority can use and enjoy public spaces, safe from ASB.

2. Key Issues for Consideration

- 2.1 At present, the existing PSPO's provide an effective means to manage land to prevent any ASB escalating by providing additional powers to issue warnings, seize and confiscate alcohol and to stop the consumption of alcohol if necessary.
- 2.2 In the restricted areas a person commits an offence if without reasonable excuse he or she continues to carry out activities from which he or she is prohibited, namely;
 - Continuing to drink alcohol when required to stop doing so by an Authorised Officer;
 - Not surrendering any alcohol in his or her possession when required to do so by an Authorised Officer;
 - Refusal to hand over any containers (sealed or unsealed) which are believed to contain alcohol, when required to do so by an Authorised Officer.
- 2.3 This allows the Police and designated Council Officers to effectively manage and deal with situations that are alcohol related when it is consumed in a public space.
- 2.4 Since the relaxation of Covid-19 measures, an increase in visitor numbers to coastal areas and a reduction of licenced premises operating, has seen an increase in the consumption of take away alcohol in public spaces and this has occasionally resulted in associated ASB.
- 2.5 As the Council will not tolerate ASB in its public spaces, the renewal of the existing PSOPO's with additional areas will allow the Council to robustly manage its Resorts, Town Centres and Open Spaces.
- **2.6** The following areas have been added to the existing schedule for Council consideration:

Cosmeston Country Park

Porthkerry Country Park

Penarth Pier and Esplanade

Ogmore beach and surrounding common land

Rhoose Point

Llantwit Major Beach

2.7 The 6 new areas that are proposed will provide the Council with the new powers to help manage ASB in these areas. This summer the Council was restricted in its ability to respond to increased ASB as a result of increased alcohol consumption, at these locations, in the absence of an Order.

- 2.8 The renewal of the existing Orders and the addition of 6 new areas are subject to public consultation. The Council has a statutory duty to consult when proposing to introduce PSPO's and when renewing them every 3-years. Although s.72 of the Act does not declare a length of time in terms of a consultation period, the previous consultation exercise was undertaken for 6-weeks which is deemed reasonable and comparable when the existing Orders were created.
- 2.9 The initial consultation for this renewal commenced 26th July 2020 for a period of 6-weeks, but it was extended for a further 6-weeks until 2nd November 2020 as it generated a lot of interest from stakeholders. It was deemed appropriate to capture as many views as possible to receive a balanced view before creating new PSPO's.
- 2.10 From the consultation, two fifths of respondents (39.8%) live in the Penarth area including Dinas Powys and Sully. Also, another third (34.7%) live in the West Barry, Rhoose and St Athan area. 13.6% live in the CF63 area of East Barry and 4.5% in the Llantwit Major area. The remaining 7.4% are from the Ogmore-by-Sea & Ogmore Vale, Cardiff West, Bonvilston & Wenvoe, Pontyclun & Llantrisant, Radyr, Tongwynlais & Nantgarw, Cowbridge and the general Cardiff CF Postcode areas.
- **2.11** A majority of respondents (54%) are female, whilst 40% are male. The remaining 6% preferred not to say.
- 2.12 A large proportion (52%) of the respondents are in the 35-54 age category, 28% of respondents are in the 55-74 age category and 8% in the 25-34 category. The remaining 12% are in the 75+ age category (6%), 18-24 (5%) and Under 18 (1%). At least 65% either strongly agree or agree with the proposals at each of the new proposed areas. Ogmore beach and surrounding common land is the new proposed area with the highest percentage of responders with agree or strongly agree.
- **2.13** Overall an overwhelming majority of 79% of responders strongly agree or agree with the extension to the current alcohol restricted areas.
- 2.14 In relation to locations not contained within the new proposed areas, 73% of respondents do not think that there are other areas in the Vale of Glamorgan that should be considered for the introduction of a PSPO, while 27% of respondents felt that they would like other areas considered. These areas included all parks and public spaces, Barry Waterfront and Penarth Town Centre.
- 2.15 During the period of 20 October 2017 and 13 November 2020 the number of Alcohol related ASB instances were recorded and are arranged by location and detailed as attached, Appendix A. There were 70 instances of ASB in existing PSPO locations with Alexandra Park including the Tennis Courts, Penarth and Broad Street, Barry having 17 and 15 instances respectively.
- 2.16 In the areas that are proposed for new Orders, there were 18 instances with 13 at Penarth Pier & Esplanade alone. During the 3-year period, the average number of instances at each of the existing locations is 1.42 whereas the average at each

of the proposed locations is 3.00. The ASB rate at the proposed locations is 111.27% higher compared to the existing PSPO areas. This demonstrates that implementation of PSPO's can be a factor in reducing the rate of Alcohol related ASB instances.

- 2.18 The existing Orders expired in October 2020 so it will be necessary to agree new Orders to ensure the Council achieves its Corporate commitments, Appendix C. In the absence of Orders, the Council and Police will have greater difficulty preventing or stopping ASB associated with the consumption of alcohol in designated areas.
- 2.19 There were concerned raised by licensed premises specifically on Penarth Esplanade as detailed in the Consultation Report to the creation of new Orders and the impact that these would have on the businesses. However, the orders are not intended to affect licensed premises and their ability to sell alcohol in their licensed zones. The Orders apply to ASB only and not simply the consumption of alcohol.
- 2.20 It will not be an offence to drink alcohol in a controlled drinking zone. However, it will be an offence to fail to comply with the request to cease drinking by an officer or surrender alcohol, in a controlled drinking zone. Possible sanctions include a Fixed Penalty Notice (FPN) or a fine of up to level 2 upon conviction.
- 2.21 Creating an Order is intended to make public spaces more welcoming to the majority of law-abiding citizens and communities and not simply restrict activities. This should enhance the areas covered by Orders by providing safe and secure environments.

3. How do proposals evidence the Five Ways of Working and contribute to our Well-being Objectives?

- 3.1 Long term the Orders will safeguard the Council's long-term strategic outlook regarding tourism and ensure it has robust measures to provide safe and secure environments of our citizens and visitors.
- 3.2 Integration The introduction of new Orders and the proposal to renew the existing PSPOS's demonstrates an integrated approach to robustly managing our Resorts, Town Centres and Open Spaces and demonstrates that the Council will not tolerate Anti-Social Behaviour in respect of alcohol consumption.

- 3.3 Involvement By undertaking a comprehensive 12-week consultation process involving all our stakeholders it will ensure that citizens and visitors are engaged regarding the management of Resorts, Town Centres and Open Spaces in respect of Anti-Social Behaviour and the associated Orders.
- 3.4 Collaboration The proposals will involve working in collaboration with Town Councils, Community Councils, South Wales Police and Community Support Officers.
- 3.5 Prevention Consideration will need to be given as to whether prohibitions in one area will displace the problem behaviour elsewhere, or into a neighbouring Authority.
- 3.6 The consumption of alcohol in public places can lead to nuisance, violence and disorder. The proposed Orders, restricting the consumption of alcohol within a public place will help to prevent alcohol related Anti-Social Behaviour.

4. Resources and Legal Considerations

Financial

- **4.1** All Order publications will be provided bilingually, and signs will be created in compliance with the Welsh Language Act 1993.
- 4.2 There will be an approximate cost of £2,500 to produce and install the signs and this will be funded from the relevant revenue budgets.

Legal (Including Equalities)

- **4.3** The extension of the PSPO's and proposal to vary them by increasing the number of restricted areas covered by them will require approval from Full Council.
- 4.4 The legal authority to make, extend, vary or discharge a PSPO is set out in the Antisocial Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014. The publication of a PSPO is as required by the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 (Publication of Public Spaces Protection Orders) Regulations 2014.
- 4.5 The legal test and the two conditions as detailed elsewhere in the report permits a Local Authority to make a PSPO where it is satisfied on reasonable grounds that the two conditions are met pursuant to section 59 (1) and (2) of the Act.
- **4.6** The test requires that the behaviour being restricted must:

Be having, or likely to have, a detrimental effect on the quality of life of those in the locality; or

It is likely that activities will be carried on in a public place within that area and that they will have such an effect.

The second condition is that;

Is, or is likely to be, of a persistent or continuing nature,
Is, or is likely to be, such as to make the activities unreasonable, and
Justifies the restrictions imposed by the notice.

- 4.7 The making of a PSPO must be reasonable to prevent or reduce the detrimental effect of the problem behaviour, or reduce the detrimental effect continuing, occurring or reoccurring.
- 4.8 Necessary consultation must be carried out to include amongst other things a consideration of the scope of the Order, the areas covered, the impact of the proposals and an analysis of how restrictions meet the legal test.
- 4.9 An interested person may appeal to the High Court to question the validity of a PSPO, or a variation of an Order.
- **4.10** A Local Authority is required to have regard to specific restrictions which apply upon the making or variation of a PSPO as set out in 'the Act'.
- **4.11** An interested person may apply to the High Court to question the validity of a PSPO, or a variation of an Order.
- **4.12** An appeal must be made within the period of 6 weeks beginning with the date on which the Order or any variation is made.
- **4.13** A Local Authority is required to have regard to Articles 10 and 11 of the Human Rights Act 1998 regarding freedoms permitted of the freedom of expression and freedom of assembly and association.
- **4.14** A local Authority who is satisfied following a necessary consultation that it is reasonable to make, extend, vary, or discharge a PSPO is required to publish the text of it for any variation, and publish the proposal for any extension of it.

1.0 Introduction

Public Space Protection Order - Controlled Alcohol Zones

The Council's Cabinet recently agreed to consult on the proposal to vary the current Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO) in place by increasing the restricted areas covered by it, in respect of alcohol related Anti-Social Behaviour.

The current PSPO was introduced in 2017 and is due to be reviewed before it expires in October 2020.

In light of recent incidents related to anti-social behaviour and mass gatherings, the Council is seeking to extend the order to cover six new locations and the renewal of existing locations. The new locations are:

- Cosmeston Country Park
- Porthkerry Country Park
- Penarth Pier and Esplanade
- Ogmore beach and surrounding common land
- Cwm Col-Huw in Llantwit Major
- Rhoose Point

1.2 ASB Summary

During the period of 20 October 2017 and 13 November 2020 the number of Alcohol related ASB instances were recorded and are arranged by location in <u>Appendix J.</u>

There were 70 instances of ASB in existing PSPO locations with Alexandra Park including Tennis Courts, Penarth and Broad Street, Barry having 17 and 15 instances respectively.

In areas under the proposed PSPO, there were 18 instances with 13 at Penarth Pier & Esplanade.

During the 3 year period, the average number of instances at each of the existing locations is 1.42 whereas the average at each of the proposed locations is 3.00.

The ASB rate at the proposed locations is 111.27% higher compared to the existing PSPO areas.

This demonstrates that implementation of PSPOs can be a factor in reducing the rate of Alcohol reated ASB instances.

2.0 Survey

The online survey ran from 26th July 2020 to 2nd November 2020 and received 197 responses. 99% of responses were submitted in English and 1% in Welsh. A copy of the survey is contained in *Appendix A*. The survey included a number of questions as well as the opportunity to make comments.

Due to the volume of responses, this consultation report summarises the main issues raised but full details of every comment received can be found in the Appendices.








The chart below shows where the respondents to the survey live. Areas are derived from the postcodes provided.




Two fifths of respondents (39.8%) live in the Penarth area including Dinas Powys and Sully. 
A majority of respondents (54%) are female, whilst 40% are male. The remaining 6% preferred not to say.




Over threequarters of respondents (79%) answered that their day to day activities are not limited. 1% responded limited a little and 3% limited a lot. 7% prefer not to say.

When asked to describe their ethnic group, the vast majority (81%) answered White - Welsh / English / Scottish / Northern Irish / British.



The chart below shows whether respondents agree or disagree with the proposals to extend the order to 6 new locations.




Main Themes

- The area with the highest percentage strongly disagreeing or disagreeing is Penarth Pier and Esplanade.




The below chart illustrates the respondents views with regards to the extension of the current alcohol restricted areas PSPO.

The remaining 35% agree (14%), disagree (7%), strongly disagree (12%) and neutral (%).






Main Themes

We write on behalf of Penarth and Penarth.

Our clients wish us to object to the adoption of Penarth Pier and Esplanade within the proposed Public Space Protection Order (control alcohol zone) PSPO.

We are respectful of the fact that the authority is obliged to review the current PSPO before its expiry in October 2020. And we are entirely respectful of the fact that it may very well be appropriate for new areas to be brought within the Pier view of the PSPO. As the consultation and the cabinet report makes plain some areas have recently experienced antisocial behaviour, regrettably this has been a feature of the summer and the Covid lockdown period. Ogmore Beach, as an example has had a significant and high profile experience following various disturbances and, frankly, disturbing scenes as reported in the press and media.

However, our clients do not accept that the concerns that attach to an area such as Ogmore Beach, can fairly be said to attach to Penarth Pier and Esplanade.

It is right that the area is vibrant and it's also right that there are a number of hospitality businesses that have opened and traded throughout this difficult period. However, these premises have worked tirelessly to ensure that the manner in which they operate is both sensitive and appropriate to the location. These premises, and the other premises on and around the Penarth Pier and Esplanade have done so such that customer behaviour and conduct in and around "the front" has not generated antisocial behaviour or difficulty.

Indeed bearing in mind the volumes of people that have enjoyed the facilities and the conduct of both the premises and the customers/visitors could fairly be described as exemplary.

Furthermore we note that none of the documents supporting this consultation appeared to provide any evidence the basis on which the new areas could and should fall within the PSPO. We are not concerned with the areas outside of Penarth, but we are surprised that something as significant as a PSPO proposal to adopt has not included the evidence that merits this new legal step. We would respectfully suggest that any consultation that seeks to obtain the views of residents and businesses, where it appears that the proposal is to move forward, could and should disclose that evidence so that there is a transparent understanding of what's being considered and why. That appears to be absent here. Indeed its absence undermines the consultation.

Whilst our clients instruct us to object to this proposal (insofar as Penarth is concerned) and therefore we wish to see it refused, if you are to proceed, then we would also invite you to withdraw the current consultation and produce a fulsome and cohesive evidential basis, in order to legitimise the consultation and the proposal. We'd respectfully suggest that for a consultation of this sort to be legitimate and transparent, the evidence has to be included as part of the considerations, lest the matter be open to legal challenge.



- Rhoose Point






Map of current and proposed areas in Barry















































Map of current and proposed areas in Penarth

























Map of current and proposed areas in Rural Vale



PUBLIC SPACE PROTECTION ORDER 2020

ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR, CRIME AND POLICING ACT 2014

The Vale of Glamorgan Council (the Council) in exercise of its powers under Sections 59 and 72 of the Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 (the Act) and under all other enabling powers, herby makes the following Order:

- 1. This Order shall come into effect on **7**th **December 2020** and shall have an effect for 3 years thereafter, unless extended by further Orders under the Council's statutory powers.
- 2. This Order relates to the specified areas listed in the below Schedule.
- 3. The Council is satisfied that the conditions set out in Section 59(2) of the Act have been met. Namely that alcohol related anti-social behaviour and criminal activities have been carried out within the specified areas. This behaviour has a detrimental effect on the quality of life of those in the locality, and it is likely that these activities will be carried out within that area and has such effect.
- 4. The Council is also satisfied that the conditions set out in Section 59(3) of the Act have been met. Namely, that the effect or likely effect of the activities is, or is likely to be, of a persistent or continuing nature and that these activities are unreasonable and justify the restrictions imposed by this Order and that it is in all the circumstances expedient to make this Order for the purpose of reducing crime and/or anti-social behaviour in a public place.

Restrictions

- 1. The effect of this Order is to impose the following conditions on the Restricted Area:
 - 1.1 In the Restricted Area a person commits an offence if without reasonable excuse he or she continues to carry out activities from which he or she is prohibited, namely;
 - 1.1.1 Continuing to drink alcohol when required to stop doing so by an Authorised Officer.
 - 1.1.2 Not surrendering any alcohol in his or her possession when required to do so by an Authorised Officer.

- 1.1.3 Refusal to hand over any containers (sealed or unsealed) which are believed to contain alcohol, when required to do so by an Authorised Officer.
- An 'Authorised Officer' can be a Council employee, a person designated by the Council, a Police Officer or Police Community Support Officer who is authorised in writing by the Vale of Glamorgan Council for the purposes of giving directions under this Order.

Fixed Penalty Notice and Offences

- 1. It is an offence for a person without reasonable excuse to engage in the activities restricted on this Order.
- 2. In accordance with Section 63 of the Act, a person found to be in breach of this Order by consuming alcohol when asked not to do so or by refusing to surrender alcohol to an authorised person is liable on summary conviction to a maximum penalty of a level 2 fine.
- An authorised person may issue a Fixed Penalty Notice to anyone he or she believes has committed an offence. You will pay a reduced Penalty if paid within 14 days. If you pay the Fixed Penalty Notice within 29 days you will not be prosecuted.
